outside of calendar dates, all programs would need to opt-in. Programs can make their admission policies greater than the university policy, but not lower.

- Adele likes that it is collecting data.
 Linda pointed out that the 2-3 students affected by this process wouldn't provide much data.
- Linda discussed that tests are not primary admission, but secondary to meeting our GPA policy.
- What is the urgency? Teaching and rehab counselor positions that are going unfilled.
- Patrick and Denise both discussed that this test is hard for students with disabilities. Patrick also said that they aren't asking for GPA to be lowered (but then it was clarified), but that they have another avenue of meeting conditions
- Finally, GZ said that it was clear that this won't work. 1-2 individuals need to either create a policy to go through catalog process or form a subcommittee. Elisa discussed making a curricular review change, but said that she didn't want to do it unless she had support outside her division. Several members wanted to help, but no one from LAS volunteered.
- As it stood this was off the table.
