Juvenile Justice Concentration

AUMP students may substitute:

- CJ 551 for CJ 451
- CJ 563 for CJ 463

Forensic Anthropology Concentration

AUMP students may substitute:

• CJ 515 for CJ 415

Law Enforcement Concentration

AUMP students may substitute:

- CJ 523 for CJ 423
- CJ 536 for CJ 436
- CJ 656 for CJ 456

The MACJ agrees to allow students who meet the university's qualification for the AUMP to enroll in up to 16 credits of CJ/JS courses that will count towards completion of the MACJ.
